Privacy Notice for Parents, Carers and Young People

1. Who We Are

Gamematesuk provides mentoring and gaming sessions for children and young people aged 8–21, including those with Special Educational Needs (SEN).

2. The Information We Collect

We collect only the information we need to run our sessions safely and effectively, such as:

- Your child's name, age, and contact details
- Information about learning or support needs (if relevant)
- Session attendance and progress notes
- Parent/carer name and contact details
- Payment details (if you are self-funding)

3. Why We Collect This Information

We use this information to:

- Provide safe and effective mentoring sessions
- Communicate with parents/carers and schools
- Keep accurate records for safeguarding and support
- Manage payments and bookings

4. Sharing Information

We will never sell your information or use it for marketing. We may share information with:

- Your child's school or local authority (if involved in their support)
- Health or safeguarding professionals, if legally required
- Secure IT providers who help us store information safely

5. How We Keep Data Safe

- Information is stored securely on password-protected systems.
- Paper records (if used) are locked away.
- Only authorised staff can access personal data.

6. How Long We Keep Data

- Children's records: up to 6 years after they leave our service (or longer if needed for safeguarding).
- Payment and financial records: 7 years (for tax and accounting).
- After this, all data is securely deleted.

7. Your Rights

You (or your child, if over 16) have the right to:

- See the information we hold about you
- Ask us to correct anything that's wrong
- Ask us to delete information (where legally possible)
- Ask us to share information with another service
